7. Revised rate of adjustment of dearness allowance fixed for the employees employed in LAC MANUFACTORY in West Bengal

NOTIFICATION

Whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act. 1948 (11. of 1948) (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), the proposal for upward revision of the rate of adjustment of dearness allowance for the employees employed in lac manufactory was published under the Labour Department Notification No. 149-MW/2W-6-91, dated the 24th September, 1992, Calcutta Gazette, Extraordinary, dated the 24th September, 1992:

. And whereas no representation was received within the stipulated period of two months in respect of the same;

Now, therefore, the Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by section 3, read with section 5, of the said Act, is pleased hereby to revise, after consulting the State Minimum Wages Advisory Board, the rate of adjustment of dearness allowance fixed under the Labour Department Notification No. 777-LW, dated the 3rd July, 1969, for the employees employed in lac manufactory in the State of West Bengal in the following manner:

Dearness allowance for the employees employed in lac manufactory shall be adjusted half-yearly, both upward and downward, above the average of Consumer Price Index Numbers for 1991 for Bankura-Midnapore series (1951 = 100) at the rate of Re. 1.00 per point per month. The first adjustment of dearness allowance on the basis of the rate as aforesaid shall be made with effect from the 1st January, 1993, on the basis of the average of Consumer Price Index Numbers for the period from January, 1992 to September, 1992. The next adjustment of dearness allowance shall be made with effect from the 1st July, 1993, on the basis of Consumer Price Index Numbers for the period from October, 1992 to March, 1993. Thereafter, adjustment of dearness allowance shall be made with effect from the 1st January and 1st July each year on the basis of the average of Consumer Price Index Numbers for the period April to September and October to March respectively.
